

Committee Reports Update - 2/20/2020

Arts & Recreation Committee

Arts & Rec Chair Stephanie Myers-Cable met with the Tuesdays at the Park (TATP) Core Team on January 27th. The schedule is currently being reviewed and entertainment vendors are being contacted for the 2020 TATP season. If you are interested in joining the Arts & Rec committee, please attend the 1st meeting of the year on February 24th at 7:30 PM at the Madisonville Rec Center. We will be discussing TATP, project collaborations with Artsville and the CRC as well as identifying other areas for arts and rec activation in Madisonville.

BEAUTIFICATION COMMITTEE - ANNUAL REPORT 2019

MINI-CLEANUPS (about 6) weeding and planting at the Pocket Park, the Murray Triangle, above the concrete walls at Kenwood & Madison, throughout the Madison/Whetsel, and Bramble/Whetsel business districts.

RAISED \$2,700 FROM NEIGHBORHOOD BUSINESSES and were granted \$1,000 by Madisonville Community Council from City of Cincinnati Neighborhood Support Program funds to pay for 20 beautiful planters in the Madison Road business district. The Cincinnati Park Board installed spring, summer, and fall plantings and watered throughout the year. Thank you, Madisonville businesses!

COORDINATED WITH GO LOCAL, Crossroad Church's initiative, to work in Madisonville to continue to clear out invasive vines and brush at the St. Michael's Cemetery on Settle St with many volunteers from St Anthony Church. Go Local also helped to build up the Murray Triangle garden, and to work on other projects around the neighborhood.

PLANNED AND EXECUTED THE ANNUAL CURB APPEAL nomination and award process to honor 6 Madisonville residences/businesses for beautiful landscaping.

SUPERVISED MADISONVILLE YOUTH planting our 30 neighborhood planters, clearing up litter, weeding the Chess Parks, and painting benches at the bus stops.

COORDINATED WITH UC'S CINCY CLEANUP to clear out trash, dumped items, and underbrush along the 1/3 mile stretch of Tompkins Ave along the railroad tracks.

ORGANIZED TAKING ROOT MADISONVILLE to plant 35 trees in Madisonville—at residences and at Madisonville's Little Parks—and cleared out deadly tree vines and suckers from the trees along Roe Street from Plainville Road to Whetsel Ave. Volunteers from our neighborhood's Seven Hills School provided the man and woman power!

Unfortunately, the topic of discussion involved the numerous recent burglaries to our neighbors' homes. Everyone present had an opportunity to report what they have experienced and as well as discuss some possible solutions. Thanks to Captain Jones, we all received valuable information about the status of the investigations.

As promised, I have attached a copy of an Incident Report form that our committee drafted to help neighbors report crime or suspicious activity that they witness. Often times, when we witness something startling, we forget the details. Hopefully, the Incident Report form will help guide you at or near the incident in remembering details to report to the police. Please feel free to share with other neighbors. There will also be copies at the next general council meeting on **Thursday, February 20th at 7:00 p.m.**

I would like to start "coffee walks" around our neighborhood in an effort to be more visibly engaged in our community. Sure, we have Citizens on Patrol, but they cannot do it all. The idea behind the "coffee walks" would be groups of neighbors walking together, having a nice cup of hot coffee or tea or cocoa, and watching over our neighborhood. The benefits would be 1) getting to know each other; 2) getting some exercise; and 3) a safer neighborhood. NOFA Updates

The City awarded two separate grants for MCURC to build new moderate-income homes in Madisonville and we will soon be getting started. We will be building 9 houses in total at lots scattered across the neighborhood. These houses will be an updated version of the 4 we built last year on Peabody and Ravenna. They will be sold to owner-occupants who make at or below 115% of area median income. We're still waiting on a contract from the City to get started, but that should be coming soon. 
